<p>Have COVID-19 Symptoms?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Congestion/Runny Nose</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Sore Throat</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Fever &gt; 100.4F</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> New Cough</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Loss of Taste/Smell</li> </ul>	<p><b>STAY HOME!</b></p> <p>Seek testing for COVID-19 and report to Compliance and Safety</p> <p>Instructors will work with you on make-up work, and you should join your in-person classes virtually through WebEx.</p>	<p><b>STAY HOME!</b></p> <p>Seek testing for COVID-19 and report to Compliance and Safety and Employee Health</p>	<p>Stay home for at least 5 days. Day 0 is your first day of symptoms and day 1 is your first full day after symptoms developed.</p> <p>Return after the 5 full days if fever-free for 24 hours* and symptoms have improved. Masking is required upon return.</p> <p>If symptoms have not improved, or still have a fever, wait until you are fever-free for 24 hours*</p> <p>If you have access to testing, it is recommended (but not required) towards the end of your 5 day isolation period.</p> <p><small>*without the use of fever reducing medication</small></p>
<p>Have a COVID positive family member – or have had close contact exposure with someone who is C19 positive?</p>	<p><b>If you're symptomatic, stay home!</b></p> <p>Instructors will work with you on make-up work, and you should join your in-person classes virtually through WebEx.</p>	<p><b>If you're symptomatic, stay home!</b></p> <p>Regardless of your situation, report all information as required.</p>	<p>No requirements</p> <div style="text-align: right;">  <p><b>MOUNT CARMEL</b> College of Nursing</p> </div>
