

### Dr. Schiele Receives Regional Recognition



On March 14, our MCCN President/ Dean, Ann Schiele, PhD, RN, was one of just 20 educators highlighted in Columbus Business First, People to Know in Education.

Once a month, this pre-eminent business publication in the Columbus area spotlights 20 individuals from the region who are front and center in their industries, from health care to finance to technology and many industry sectors in between. This *Columbus Business First* feature focuses on Central Ohioans deeply engaged in their work and leading their companies and communities.

The profile includes background on Dr. Schiele's choice of the profession of nursing, her insights

### **Two Grad Students Published**

**Kendrah Kiener and Andrea Warren** accomplished a significant achievement when they were both recently published in the *Mount Carmel Health System Education Newsletter* (March/April 2013 issue) that goes out to the entire Mount Carmel Health System. The articles arose from the work Kiener and Warren each did on presentations for the graduate course (N 530 Adult Health Practicum).

"Both of these students are in the nursing education track. I think it is unusual for them to be published in such a publication," said Associate Professor **Ann Waterman**, **PhD, RN.** "I like that they are contributing and making a difference already in their roles as graduate students."

Kiener wrote a short piece about Nursing Resources to use for patient care. In the article, Kiener points out that "Mount Carmel has many informational resources available at your fingertips!" and lists several, including the Intranet, Library, Clinical educators, Pharmacists, PICC Nurses, Rapid Response Team, Reference books, and WOC Nurses.

Kiener also cites particular examples, including Intranet sources: Policy and Procedures, IV guidelines, IV Compatibility, and Care Paths. She also mentions Library resources, such as Davis' Drug Guide, Mosby's Nursing Consult (provides CEs), Taber's Cyclopedia Medical Dictionary, and access to nursing and medical journal articles, as well as the Library Live Chat available Monday – Friday.

Warren's educational offering is the announcement of an OB Education event, an inservice where she presented on sepsis and the OB population. The newsletter article written by Warren offers a brief introduction to the topic.

Warren writes that the "physiological changes of pregnancy may mask the clinical signs of sepsis." She adds that "early recognition and diagnosis with rapidly instituted therapy are key to ensuring a good outcome." Warren also includes the statistic that "worldwide, sepsis accounts for 15% of maternal deaths."

"I commend both of these graduate students and acknowledge their accomplishments," said Waterman.

### Recent MCCN Graduate Recognized for Life-Saving Actions

**Colleen Kenny,** March 2013 graduate, rushed to the aid of a gentleman who suffered cardiac arrest at LA Fitness in Grandview. Kenny, who works at the front desk of LA Fitness in Grandview, was called by a colleague about a man passed out in the locker room.

"When I went back there the guy was on the ground and turning blue. I immediately checked his pulse and gave him two rescue breaths because he looked like he was gasping for air," said Kenny, "I checked his pulse again and he did not have a pulse, so I started chest compressions."

Kenny was assisted by another person at the gym, Michael Wellner, a medical intern at The Ohio State University. Wellner continued the chest compressions and then Kenny administered an automated external defibrillator (AED).

Kenny was with the man for several minutes until the paramedics arrived and moved the patient to OSU Hospital. The man survived.

"Anytime you are in a medical situation your heart starts racing, but I felt very comfortable because I have been in situations like this in the hospital. Although this was out of the hospital, I knew what to do right away," said Kenny.

Kenny and Wellner were recognized with awards from the Grandview Heights Fire Dept. at the Grandview City Council. The gentleman who arrested attended the presentation.

"As a nurse you save lives every day, but this is totally different because you don't get to call code blue and know that several other medical staff will be around you. I am very thankful Michael and I were able to work together," Kenny said.





## Poised to Lead: Trinity Health and Catholic Health East Officially One Organization

### Trinity Health and Catholic Health East

announced on May 1 that the consolidation of the two Catholic health care systems is closed. The result is a \$14 billion organization, serving people and communities in 21 states with 82 hospitals and 87 long term care facilities. The community benefit ministry will be about \$1 billion.

According to the official announcement, this consolidation means opportunities for our ministry, which is now better able to advance our mission. This new larger, stronger, smarter organization is more able to compete for the long term, with access to so many more resources to help our patients, communities, associates and others nationwide.

### Are You Taking a Course Elsewhere?

Any student taking a class at one of our affiliated institutions (Columbus State Community College or The Ohio State University) is required to submit a copy of his/her semester course schedule to the MCCN Records and Registration Office (Marian Hall, Room 2C01). The deadline for submitting Summer schedules is Friday, May 17.

Students must also notify MCCN Records and Registration when they drop or withdraw from an affiliated course. We have found that students are sometimes negligent with this required notification to MCCN. Remember, you must keep MCCN updated on your affiliated status!

Financial aid awards are based on total registered credit hours. Delinquent students may find themselves at less than full-time hours for financial aid calculation.

Students enrolled as freshmen in the MCCN-FMC program and taking classes at Ohio University Lancaster (OU-L) are also required to submit a copy of their semester course schedules to the MCCN Records and Registration Office (Marian Hall, Room 2C01). **The deadline for Summer schedules is Friday, May 17.** 

FMC program students must also notify MCCN Records and Registration when they drop or withdraw from an affiliated course. We have found that students are sometimes negligent with this required notification to MCCN. Remember, you must keep MCCN updated on your affiliated status!
