

Mount Carmel College of Nursing Celebrates Milestone Commencement Weekend With Record Number of Graduates



Mount Carmel College of Nursing's (MCCN) Commencement, held Saturday, May 10 at Grove City Church of the Nazarene, served as a milestone event in more ways than one. Not only did MCCN graduate a record 244 undergraduate and graduate students, led in procession by Faculty Marshal Fatma Al-Lamki, MSN, RN, but it was also the final commencement for MCCN President and Dean **Ann Schiele, PhD, RN,** who is stepping down in July after serving the College after serving Mount Carmel for 53 years. The weekend also included the Pinning and Recognition Ceremony for graduates, held the evening before, Friday, May 9, also at Grove City Church of the Nazarene. The tradition of presenting pins to nursing graduates dates back to 1860, when Florence Nightingale wanted graduates of the first professional nursing program in London to stand out and be respected, so she designed a pin for graduates to wear on their uniforms. By 1916, awarding pins became a common practice for all nursing graduates in North America and the United Kingdom. Today each nursing institution awards their own uniquely designed pin, which is awarded by faculty to new graduates, symbolizing entry into the field of nursing.

Wagner.** This award is bestowed on the student(s), voted by peers, who served as a consistent role model(s) for motivation, positive influence and encouragement and who inspired others to achieve at their highest potential.



Changes Coming to Convocation

With the upcoming academic year, MCCN is changing Convocation to be consistent with the practice of other colleges and universities across the country. Instead of being a mandatory event for all students, Convocation now will only include incoming new students, their families, plus MCCN faculty and staff. To better facilitate this, Convocation will be held in conjunction with new student orientation. This year's event will take place Thursday, August 14 at 5 p.m. at nearby Holy Family Catholic Church.

Students: Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors no longer must attend Convocation. The event has been changed to be part of orientation and will include only new incoming students, their families and MCCN faculty and staff.

MCCN Welcomes Christine Wynd, PhD, RN, as Presidential Transition Begins June 30

MCCN will begin the transition to a new President and Dean when Christine Wynd, PhD, RN, begins her new duties at the College on June 30. Ann Schiele, PhD, RN, outgoing President and Dean, will be helping Dr. Wynd acclimate to the College and her new role before stepping down in July.

Dr. Wynd comes to MCCN from the Breen School of Nursing at Ursuline College in Pepper Pike, Ohio, where she served as Dean and Strawbridge Professor since 2007, presiding over the School that offers both undergraduate and graduate programs in nursing. Her experience in nursing education and leadership is extensive and includes directing the PhD in Nursing program at the University of Akron and teaching at both The Ohio State University and Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Wynd retired from the U.S. Army Reserve Nurse Corps at the rank of colonel in 2001. Her military experience includes serving as chief nurse for two separate Combat Support Hospitals and as the Reserve representative to the office of the assistant chief, Army Nurse Corps.

Dr. Wynd received her Doctoral degree (PhD) in Nursing Executive Administration from Case Western Reserve University, a Master of Science degree in nursing from The Ohio State University and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from Saint John College. She is married to Charles Santose and has two grown children, Rachel Santose, who lives in Gouverneur, New York, and son Nathan Wynd, who resides in Columbus, Ohio.

Dr. Wynd will take center stage in her new role at Convocation, to be held in conjunction with new student orientation beginning August 14, and again at her formal Presidential Inauguration, to be held in October.

Trisha Beeler Presents Evidenced-Based Research on Smoking Cessation at Nationwide Children's Hospital for Nurses Day

As part of an assignment for her pediatrics clinical rotation, graduating senior **Trisha Beeler** chose the issue of smoking during and after pregnancy for a poster presentation. As a result of this presentation, and the fact that Trisha works as a Patient Care Assistant (PCA) at Nationwide Children's Hospital (NCH), Trisha presented the group's project at a special Nurses Day presentation at NCH on May 5.

The presentation focused on the fact that smoking during and after pregnancy has multiple health consequences for both the mother and the newborn baby. There are many programs available to pregnant moms who are smokers, but many are unaware of them. The presentation focused on educating all healthcare providers on how to provide effective smoking cessation information and feel comfortable about it at the same time.

"I see multiple parents a day walk into the hospital after smoking a cigarette and enter a patient's room. There are so many ways to keep a child safe and out of the hospital and smoking cessation is one of those! I am a huge advocate for prevention, so why not start by protecting our innocent children?" Beeler said.

MCCN Wishes Three Retiring Faculty Well

MCCN recently said a bittersweet farewell to three retiring faculty: Doug Maier, MS, RD, LD; Bonnie Moses, RN, MS; and Kip Sexton, MS, RN.

Maier worked part-time in Mount Carmel College of Nursing from 2004–14, working with students to integrate nutrition knowledge in their evidence-based practice when caring for patients. He also worked part-time at Mount Carmel West from 1997–2012.

Moses has a long history with Mount Carmel, having worked full-time in the School of Nursing from 1978-1992, then in Mount Carmel Health System from 1992–2006. She returned to Mount Carmel College of Nursing from 2007–14 as a part-time faculty member. She officially retires on August 1.

Sexton worked at the School and College of Nursing since August 1964. She was full time until 2002, mainly teaching anatomy and physiology. In 2002, she began working as the RN-BSN Advisor and later as the Master's Program Advisor. She retired as an Assistant Professor and was awarded Faculty Emeritus earlier in May.

Are You Taking a Course Elsewhere?

Any student taking a class at one of our affiliated institutions, Columbus State Community College or The Ohio State University, is required to submit a copy of his/her semester course schedule to the MCCN Records and Registration Office (Marian Hall, Room 201). The deadline for submitting Summer schedules was Friday, May 16.

Students also must notify MCCN Records and Registration when they drop or withdraw from an affiliated course. We have found that students are sometimes negligent with this required notification to MCCN. Remember: you must keep MCCN updated on your affiliated status!

Financial aid awards are based on total registered credit hours. Delinquent students may find themselves at less than full-time hours for financial aid calculation.

If you are currently taking an affiliated course or have withdrawn from an affiliated course and have not already notified Records and Registration, please do so immediately.

Students at Ohio University Lancaster

Students enrolled as freshmen in the MCCN-FMC program and taking classes at Ohio University Lancaster (OU-L) also are required to submit a copy of their semester course schedules to the MCCN Records and Registration Office (Marian Hall, Room 201). The deadline for Summer schedules was Friday, May 16.

FMC program students also must notify MCCN Records and Registration when they drop or withdraw from an affiliated course. We have found that students are sometimes negligent with this required notification to MCCN. Remember: you must keep MCCN updated on your affiliated status!

Community Service

Social Responsibility is one of the "Core Values" contained in the mission of Mount Carmel College of Nursing. In accordance with the College's Mission and Catholic Identity, the Community Service requirement for nursing students includes the application of one's skills and time to meet identified community needs of vulnerable and at-risk populations (e.g., children, elderly, homeless, poor and underserved, and organizations that support these populations).

This activity leads to learning and development through active participation in thoughtfully organized service that:

- ➤ is conducted in and meets the needs of the community
- ➤ involves reflection and analysis of the experience
- promotes the development of leadership skills, citizen skills, and social responsibility

Pre-licensure students are required to complete 20 clock hours of community service **prior** to the beginning of the last semester of enrollment (RNs enrolled in the BSN Completion Program and SDAP students must satisfactorily complete 10 clock hours).

Pre-licensure students who do not meet the deadline will be required to complete an additional 10 clock hours (for a total of 30 hours) in order to meet the graduation requirement. RN-BSN and SDAP students who do not meet the deadline will be required to complete an additional 5 clock hours (for a total of 15 hours) in order to meet the graduation requirement.

Any student who does not meet the requirement by the policy deadline may participate in Commencement activities but will not receive a diploma or be eligible for NCLEX-RN testing until this requirement is met.
